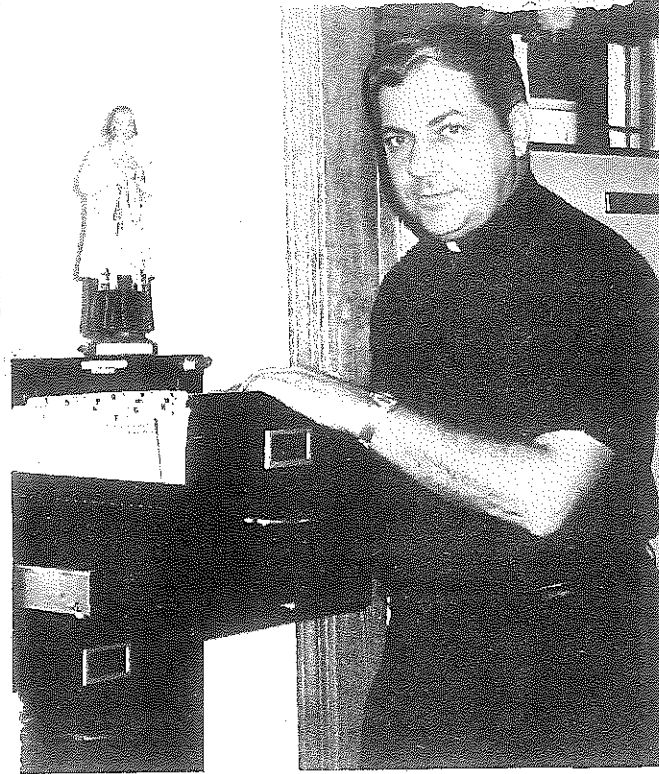

(Editor's Note: This is the seventh in a series of articles entitled "Know Your Minister." It is our hope this series will highlight the quality of religious leadership in the area, thus serving the long-time community residents, as well as the newcomers).

"It is one of the highlights of my ministry to see the tremendous faith of so many people in a day when others say faith is dying," says Father Joseph J. Beltran of the new Corpus Christi Catholic Church in Stone Mountain.

Father Beltran, this week's "Minister of the Week," came to Stone Mountain 15 months ago to aid in the establishment of Corpus Christi. He has seen the congregation grow to 560 families and is "impressed by the fantastic enthusiasm and drive this congregation has."

The parishioners are energetically working for their own building and until it is built they are meeting at the Stone Mountain Elementary School. Ground-breaking for the new church and educational building should be in 1973, he said.

"The basic idea is for me to serve the people of the Catholic Church and the community and try to help them understand the message of Christ and apply it to the modern world," explains Father Beltran.

In further expressing his philosophy, he goes on to say, "you hear a lot about the 'new morality of today. There is nothing new about it, but we can apply the basic teachings of Christ to today's morality to show us the right way."

Father Beltran received his Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Sacred Theology degrees from St. Mary's College in Baltimore, Md. He is from Georgia and returned here after completing his school-

ing, and has served churches in LaGrange, Rome and Jonesboro.

Father Beltran serves on

the Archdiocesan Marriage Tribunal as a judge and is a member of the Priest's Synod of the Archdiocese.
