#### History

Over the years, Hillside has found it-self in an area of changing demographics and has become home to a strong multiracial congregation. Since its inception in 1955, the church flourished as white middle-class families joined. However, membership dropped from a high of 407 in 1964 to around 45 in 1979. As the neighborhood changed from white to African-American — a time the Rev. Winston Lawson called "white flight" an African-American pastor came to Hillside. Under Paul Smith, membership began to rise, and 269 congregants were on the roster when Smith left in 1986. A Caucasian minister followed

Smith, and then Lawson, an African-American, Joined the staff in 2001. Members recently kicked off a yearlong 50th anniversary celebration with former Atlanta Mayor Andrew Young addressing their congregation.

#### Pastor's path


Lawson, 62, is a native of Jamaica. He moved to the United States in 1970 after completing seminary in his home country. After a short stint as pastor of the United Nations Chapel in New York City, he enrolled at the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary for graduate work. In 1977, Lawson moved to Atlanta to join the staff of the General Assembly Mission Board of the Southern branch of the Presbyterian Church. In 1981, he left the board and served various churches until he was called in 2001 to take the pulpit at Hillside.

#### Ministries

The congregational care ministry directs four nurture groups for church members as they seek to build relation-ships with each other. The ministry also oversees larger events like picnics, holi-day dinners and an annual retreat. In an attempt to reach across racial barriers, Hillside partners with First Presbyterian of Atlanta and St. Andrews Presbyterian, both predominantly white congregations, according to Lawson. The Rev. Connie Lee is a partnership minister, who splits pulpit time between Hillside and First Presbyterian and coordinates joint efforts concerning refugee resettlement and prison ministries.

A drug-court ministry works with DeKalb County to offer rehabilitation alternatives for first-time offenders. The church's criminal justice ministry also teams with the Georgia Justice Project, which works with families of prisoners and drives those family members to visit loved ones in prison.

Community ministry includes a Whiz Kids tutoring program and a food pantry

that, on a recent week, served 12 families. On the international level, Hillside has formed a partnership with a Jamaican church that includes yearly pulpit exchange and mission trips to the area.

## Thoughts from the pastor

"We affirm as part of our mission the openness to all people. We cultivate that

deliberately as a mission in this church and in the Presbytery — service to the community and openness to everybody regardless of gender, race or educational background," Lawson said. "The emphasis is on justice, peace and inclusive-
