

Dear Mr. Warder:

Thank you very much for your letter of April 8th concerning the task of training our children to read and play music on the piano.

As you may know, DeKalb County is the only county in the State of Georgia which permits by law home occupations in residentially zoned areas. We believe that there is a need for education in the homes of our citizens and have made necessary legal provisions for this. At present, there are many hundreds of teachers teaching music and the other performing arts in their homes for our children.

In the particular case which you are interested a complaint was filed with the county by a neighbor of the music teacher in question, and the <u>Board of Adjustments</u>, whose duty it is to hear these complaints, decided that the music teacher could continue to teach provided that the neighbors' driveway was not obstructed. The Board of Adjustments decision is final in this case since no appeal has been filed.

Dear Mr. Manning,

It has been brought to my attention by a DeKalb County piano teacher the nature of the hearing scheduled Monday afternoon, April ll by the board of commissioners.

I am new in DeKalb County and do not wish to butt - in on someone's affairs other than my own. As a music educator and church musician, I am aware of the shortage of good piano teachers and feel it would be a mistake to enforce any ruling that would prevent this limited number of piano teachers from their task of training our children to read and play music on the piano.

From what I have been able to determine, music education is stressed only on a minimum basis in our schools. Our world has too many "spectators" in all areas of life and not enough participation. To prevent private lessons from being given in homes would cause many competent teachers to discontinue teaching. Those who did continue to teach would have increase the cost to the point that many parents would be discouraged of the value at such high costs.

I agree that a neighbor's right to free access to their property is valid. Surely some comprimise can be worked out that will not curtail the efforts of many of our teachers.

As an interested bystander, I would like to encourage your careful consideration of the lack of necessity of forcing piano teachers to set up expensive studios.
