DeKalb Church Will Join Pro-choice Rally

Since 1963, the Unitarian Universalist Association has taken a stand calling for the reform of abortion laws. In 1987, the association adopted a resolution which states in part: "that UU's actively oppose all legislation, regulation and administrative action, at any level of government, intended undermine or circumvent Roe v. Wade; and, that UU's communicate their opposition to such attempts to their legislative representatives and to the electo-

rate...."
