Brief Organizational History of Antique Lovers Club: The club organized in 1938 to study and appreciated antiques. Meetings were held on the fourth Tuesday of each month. The first meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Laurence Everhart. There were committees for publicity, courtesy and scrapbook.

Description: The collection contains 2 scrapbooks with photographs; newspaper clippings, stationery examples, postcards and programs. The book of meeting minutes contains treasurer's reports, as well as courtesy committee reports on sending flowers and cards to those who were sick. There are also reports on guest speakers. The hand created programs in the collection list offices and members and are covered with fabrics, drawings and magazine photographs. There is also a guest book kept by the club.
