Biographical Information for Morrison Family: J.J. Morrison donated \$20,000 to President Davis to help equip a regiment for the Civil War. He was appointed to the 21st Georgia Volunteer Cavalry on July 19, 1861. He was then authorized to organize a Cavalry regiment in Tennessee's army. J.J. was then appointed to Brigadier General and commanded a brigade for almost to years before the end of the war. Colonel Morrison resided in Decatur until his death in 1910. William Morrison was a DeKalb County attorney who was active in the fight to keep the county Senate seat in Decatur (rather than in Stone Mountain) in the 1890's.

Description: This collection is useful for research on Colonel J.J. Morrison's career and achievements in the military, and his son's work in DeKalb politics. Much of William's information has been compiled and kept in a small notebook, while J.J.'s information is collected loosely. The photocopies of photographs identify all shown individuals and outline their relationships with each other. There is also a printed inventory for this part of the Morrison Collection.
