Ted O. Brooke is a resident of Stone Mountain, Georgia.

Description

The Brooke Postcard collection contains postcards of Stone Mountain and the surrounding park spanning the twentieth century. The cards are individually sleeved and total 88 cards and 6 miscellaneous cards. The original arrangement of the collection by the donor began with close-up shots of the mountain and carving and progressed to far-off perspectives; this order was maintained as much as possible throughout though several cards were rearranged in order to accommodate misplaced cards.
