We the legatees if William Barnett deceased do agree to make a division of a portion is the Negroes belonging to said estate among our selves & we the undersigned do agree that Henry Matthews have a Negro boy named Thomas, twenty two years old of copper color at eleven hundred and fifty dollars which title we will warrant & defend.
