Georgia March the 12th, 1862

We the legatees if William Barnett deceased do agree to make a division of a portion is the Negroes belonging to said estate among our selves & we the undersigned do agree that Henry Matthews have a Negro boy named Thomas , twenty two years old of copper color at eleven hundred and fifty dollars which title we will warrant & defend.

Sir

In obedience to an order, requiring me to report to head quarters the number situation 26 of the company under my command - I beg leave to submit the following statement, immediately after I received orders I caused my company to be notified to appear at this place on this day I have only been able to muster 28 including officers - I have appointed a muster to be held on tomorrow week at which time I think I shall be enabled to increase the company to number of forty or thereabouts. We have no arms never having been furnished with any this is the principal reason why the company has dwindled down to its present size. Those who have been paraded today are ready for any service either in Florida or in this State if they should be required on the other page you have a list of the names of the officers & privates of the company
