GENEALOGY

The history of the families is the history of the County; that of the County the State; the State the United States.

Do not delay sending the earliest history you know of the churches, schools, business institutions, and families of DeKalb County to DeKalb Historical Society to be filed for posterity and future historians.

AUSTIN-WYCHE; AUSTIN-FORD

Thomas Austin, M.D., b. S. C. 26 April 1784 (grandson of Capt. Nathaniel Austin, Am. Rev., S. C., who came from Va. to Gilder Plantation, S. C., son of Nathaniel Jr.). Thomas m. Susan Wyche, S. C., Oct. 1, 1804 Their son, John Cooper Austin (b. Feb. 27, 1806, S.C.) m. Cynthia Huey, Sept. 7, 1826; their son Thomas Henry (b. June 20, 1834) m. Eunice (Neacy) Ayres (b. Jan. 20, 1836) (dau. of Wm. Ayres); their son Daniel E. m. Elizabeth Morgan; their dau. Elizabeth m. Harold Augustus Ford; their son: Austin McNeill Ford.

BAILEY-HASLETT; COOPER-FORD

Edmund Jackson Bailey (a Scot) married Charlotte Etheridge (English). Their dau., Nancy Jane, m. Wm. Benj. Haslett, Jr. (b. Jan. 25, 1848) (son of Wm. Benj. & Mahaley Corley Haslett). Their dau., Annie Lee, m. Augustus Clay Ford who was the son of James Landrum (Gwinnett Co.) (b. Dec. 20, 1834) and Lavina Cooper Ford (b. Feb. 24, 1836). Parents of James Landrum Ford: Samuel & Sarah Ford (b. S. C. 1800), Gwinnett Co., Ga. Parents of Lavina Cooper: Levi M. (b. Ga. 1808) & Martha Bedingsfield Cooper (b. Ga. 1812), Gwinnett Co., Ga.

BELL

James Bell sold his plantation and store in Elbert Co., Ga., near Ruckersville and moved his wife Susan Key Bell and 10 children to Terminus in 1842. He was a merchant on Decatur St. near Pryor. He died in 1847, and his widow, before moving back to Elbert County to make her home on the old Key farm with her son Lyeurgus, erected a box tomb over his grave in Oakland Cemetery, Atlanta, and on it put the names of her husband and all of the children, who were: Atterbury Addison, Mariamni, Jeddediah Flavus (who went to Calif. in 1849), Jasper Madison (killed in the battle of Shiloh), James Eugene, Henry Bibb, Margenius Assyrmus, Emily Adelaine, Lyeurgus, and Marcus Aurelius (who married Mary Jane, the eldest daughter of Eli Jennings Hulsey, whose father, Jennings Hulsey came to Georgia from Virginia). (They are the parents of Piromis Hulsey Bell, of Candler Road, Decatur, Route 1.)

Moses W. Formwalt, the first mayor of Atlanta, is buried on the same lot as Mr. Piromis Bell's grandfather, James Bell. He had married Elizabeth Bell, the double first cousin of Mr. Bell, who after Mr. Formwalt's death married a Mr. Asbury and moved to South Georgia. She sold the lot to Marcus Aurelius Bell.

Piromis H. Bell married Lucy Lee, the daughter of Colonel Sumter Lee of Selma, Ala.

BURFORD-BULLOCH; BURFORD-GLACK; BURFORD-AYRES

Philip H. Burford, M.D., ^{h. Jones Bullloch} married ^{incorrect} Nancy Bulloch (dau. of Len Henley and Susannah Goodloe Bulloch, N. C.). ~~He was son of Philip and Rebecca Glack Burford, Warren Co., N. C. Rebecca desc. from the Rev. James Glack, Ware Church, Va. from England 1676. Her father was John, son of James Glack, Jr. Susannah (b. Feb. 19, 1809, Ga.) dau. of Dr. Burford, m. Wm. Ayres (b. Jan. 7, 1814), DeKalb Co., Ga. Their dau. Eunice Anne (Neacy) m. Thomas H. Austin.~~
