The City Commissioners are to be elected. Four candidates are in the field, Mr. Scott Chandler, Mr. Andrew Robertson, Mr. Whet Williams and Mr. W. D. Cook two of which are to be chosen. The first three of those gentlemen are well known to all citizens of Decatur. The fourth, Mr. W. D. Cox, has resided in Decatur for five and a half years.

In order that the voters of Decatur may be informed as to all of these candidates, the following statement is given as to Mr. Cook; He graduated from Clemson College, South Carolina, with B. S. Degree, 1910; served with the American Expeditionary Force in France, with the First Division, as Major in the Engineering Corps for two years; received the French decoration, Croix de Guerre; when he returned to America did graduate work at Cornell University; taught mathematics in the Texas A. M. College for seven years; while there took a course in city manager government; received his M. S. Degree from that college; formerly connected with the State Highway Board of Georgia as Chief Highway Engineer, until dropped by Governor Raines; now Civil Engineer for Sam H. Finley in road construction; member of American Society of Civil Engineers; member of the Military Society of Engineers

Mr. Cox is a member of the American Legion, having joined Atlanta Post, No. 1, before moving to Decatur. He is a home owner and tax payer in Decatur, and his children attend the Decatur Public Schools. The purpose of this document is to furnish information to the citizens of Decatur, so that they may intelligently cast their ballots on December 1st. We consider Mr. Cox eminently qualified to serve as a commissioner.
