

TERRELL-FORD FAMILY CEMETERY.

Location: About $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile west of Bouldercrest (formerly East M^cDonough) Road a short distance southeast of the intersection of that road with Flat Shoals Road. Land Lot #144, 15th. District DeKalb County, East Atlanta District.

Recorded Nov. 21, 1931.

This old family cemetery has long since passed into disuse. It is in dense woods. No houses are nearby. Three of the graves are marked with field stones cemented together to form a sort of rock wall about two feet high upon the graves. There are numerous graves marked only with field stones head and foot. Many are not marked at all. Several Negro slaves of the Terrell and Ford families are buried here.

Miss Nancy Ford, who resides on East M^cDonough Road about two miles below East Atlanta, and a granddaughter of Coleman Ford, told the compiler on Nov. 21, 1931 that the following, among others, are buried in this cemetery:
