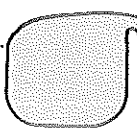


town of historic cemeteries in detail.

and asked to be kept abreast of plans for caring for the cemetery, but unfortunately I have never heard from the children since.

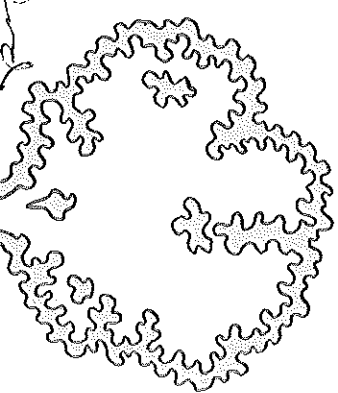
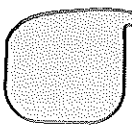

lived at Sandy Springs in
my grandfather, George Fulton Thomson, was
born in the Wright-Thomson home on
Johnson's Ferry Road. The home is now
owned and occupied by Mr. & Mrs. Roloff.
It was used as a hospital during
the Civil War.

The first wife of my great
grandfather John Thomson,
was Harriett Caroline Sweet,
daughter of James and Elizabeth
Sweet. She died very young and
is reported by
family to be
buried at or near Nancy Creek. No one knows

to know the exact spot of her grave and I'm
wondering if you have any data on the
Guess family and where their burial site
might be. In 1850, she was living with
her family in Anderson's District, De Kalb County.
She married John Thomason (first marriage
for each) in De Kalb Co. on Sept 1, 1852. She
died sometime between 1855 and 1858 as her
second and last child was born Mar 11, 1855
and my great-grandfather, a widower,
married my great-grandmother Martha Jane
Kright on December 28, 1858 in Fulton County.

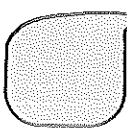
