Location: East side of Johnson Road, N.E., just north of the intersection of Highland Avenue. Land Lot #56, Decatur District, Dekalb County.

Recorded August 21, 1931.

The only inscribed marker in this cemetery is that over the grave of the Harris child. With this exception, the information about the other graves and their occupants was given to the compiler by Dr. Daniel Noble Johnson, son of Daniel, and grandson of Archibald Johnson.
