



The "Buck" Line Railroad was built by Maj. Charles Dunwoody (for whom the Dunwoody community is named) to serve the Chamblee, Dunwoody, and Roswell communities. Many Chamblee children rode the train from 1895-1925 in order to attend private schools in Roswell. The train was often called the "Dinkie" because of its narrow gauge tracks. Pylons that once held the train tracks still can be seen along the east side of Chamblee-Dunwoody Road.
