

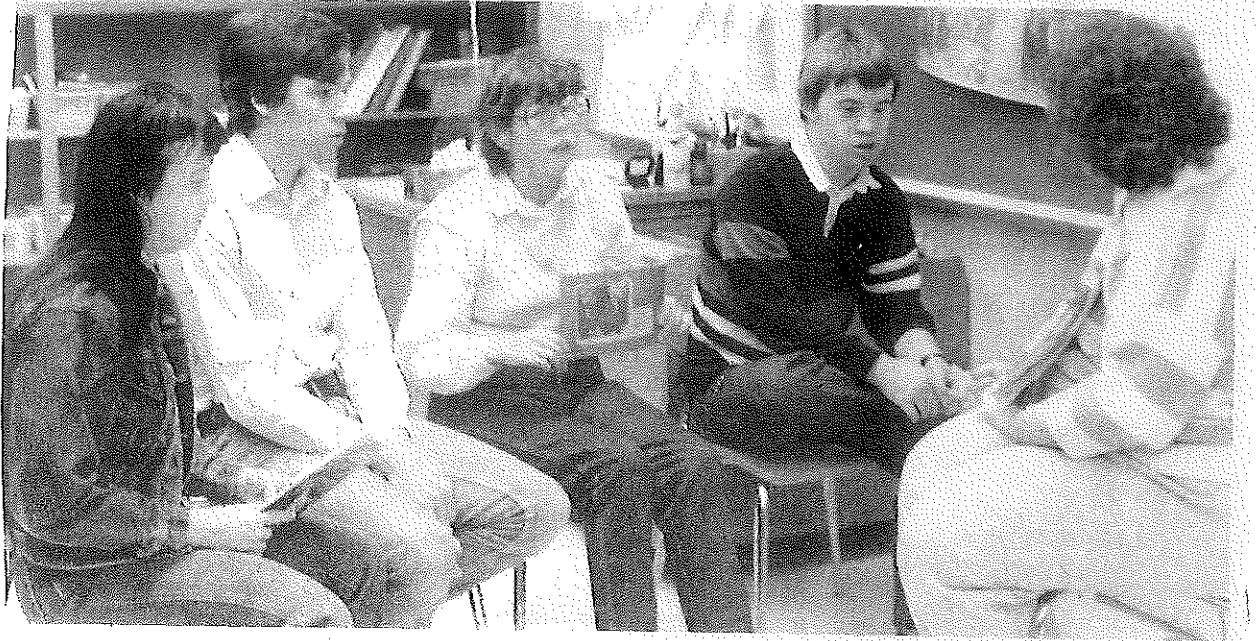

Margaret Harris Students Fingerprinted

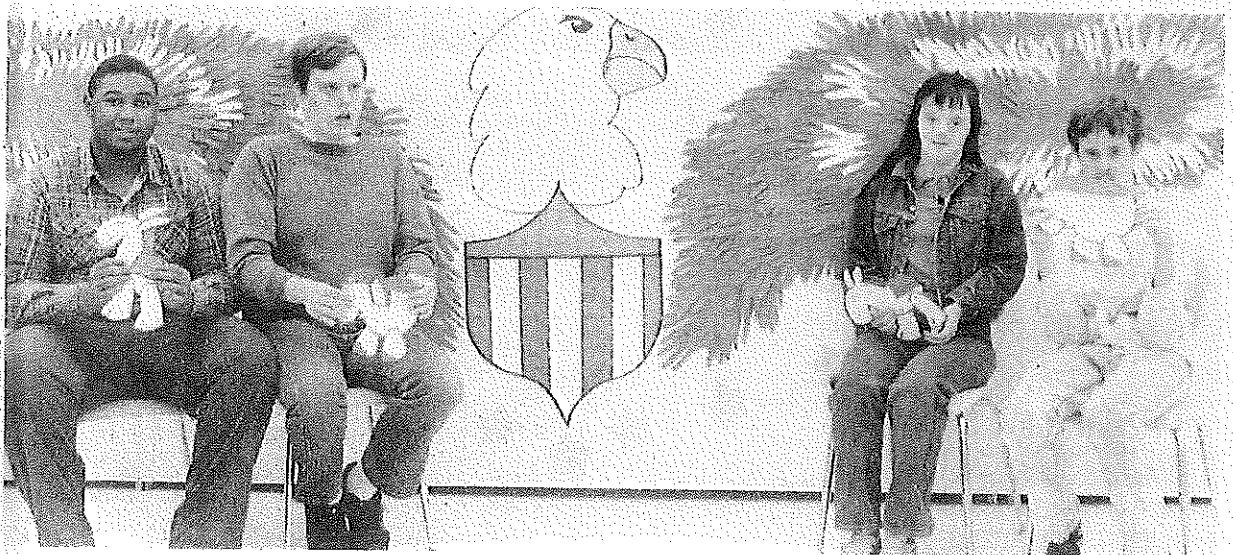
