DeKalb To Play Host To Social Science Meet

DeKalb County, for the first time, is playing host to the annual State meeting of the Georgia Council of Social Sciences, and a teacher from Idlewood School in Tucker, Mrs. Charlotte Ainsworth, will be presiding as State President of the Georgia Council.

Educators from across the state will be gathering at Stone Mountain Inn, Stone Mountain Park, on Jan. 25, 26, and 27, for the Georgia Council of Social Sciences Winter Conference.

The agenda will consist of seminar sessions under the direction of various specialists from the State Department of Education, the Uni-

versity of Georgia, as well as other Georgia colleges and Curriculum Centers.

Topics for discussion include: Workshop on Law in American Society; Social Studies on ETV; Sociological Frameworks for Teaching about Social Problems; Ideas for Improving the Teaching of Economics.

Map and Globe Skills in the Social Studies; Slow Learners, Social Studies, and Newspapers; Reading As It Is Related to the Teaching of the Social Studies; Exploring Japan Through Media.

Suggestions for Teaching Georgia Culture; Economics Education in the Schools; What, Why, and How?; Crea-

tive Approaches for the Social Studies.

A Supervisors' Meeting and an Executive Board Meeting will be held Thursday, Jan. 25. General sessions on the various topics are scheduled from 9:00-3:30 p.m. of the Jan. 26, followed by a business meeting from 4:00-5:30 p.m.

From 6:00-7:00 p.m., a reception honoring Dr. Eugene P. Odum, Alumni Foundation Professor of Zoology and Director, Institute of Ecology, University of Georgia, as well as officers and trustees of the Social Sciences Council, is being sponsored by the college and university faculty for Social Science Education in

Georgia.

A banquet is planned from 7:30-9:00 p.m., at which Mrs. Charlotte Ainsworth will preside. Alfredo Stokes, President-Elect of the Georgia Council for the Social Sciences, will present the main speaker Dr. Eugene P. Odum.

"The conference concludes at noon, Saturday, Jan. 27. 'This conference,' said Mrs. Charlotte Ainsworth, State President, 'represents a real opportunity for teachers to share ideas and keep abreast of relevant trends and effective techniques in social science education. I am excited at the prospect. DeKalb is certainly honored to act in the role of host to the Council.'
