Gresham Park area, in solving the genealogical tangle found itself with a extremely rich historical background and a passle of relatives it never knew it had. Mrs. Lowe, the descendent of the Crockett family which also produced the great frontiersman, had grown up in the Wesley Chapel area and had always heard that she was, in some way, related to the legendary

figure.
Several years ago, she and her husband, an Atlanta fireman, started searching in earnest for the proof. The hunt ended repeatedly when no record could be found of her great grandfather's name.

Mr. Lowe searched several years ago through the Georgia Archieves. They hunted through national genealogy societies and followed every lead, none of which produced any clues.






