OLD KLONDIKE BAPTIST CEMETERY

Location: A short distance Southeast of the village of Klondike, near junction of Klondike and Robinson Roads, Land Lot #144, 16th. District, Dekalb County.

This old cometery marks the site of the original Klondike Baptist Church, long since abandoned. Fimong several unmarked graves is one bearing an inscribe ed marker. It reads:

JAMES M. HOLLINGSWORTH Son of Planon & Ruth Hollingsworth. Born June 1, 1831. Died Sept. 5, 1833.




