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The first floor of the new building was completed in 1957, and on June 28, 1964, the dream of a new church building was fulfilled with the completion of the Sanctuary.

#### MUSIC MINISTRY



DeKalb County - South DeKalb residents, many of them parents of school-age kids, flock to church on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights, filling local churches to ca-

pacity.

For example, New Birth Missionary Baptist Church, one of more than two dozen churches in the area, has a membership of 15,000.

But on PTA nights, the 11 schools in the same area are often nearly empty.

With high hopes of harnessing some of the churchgoers' enthusiasm, the PTA leaders in the area have formed a task force and last week urged area churches to sponsor a "PTA Sunday" membership drive.

Sunday" membership drive.

Fewer than half of the 25 churches invited sent representatives, but all of those present agreed to host the PTA Sunday on Feb. 12.

"We don't have to start in a big way. Consistency is going to be the key," said Joan Walker, the task force's director.

"The individual PTAs have tried every

"The individual PTAs have tried every which way to get people out. What is it we're not doing? Maybe the ministers can stress the importance of being involved in schools."

The ministers were, for the most part, receptive to the PTA's plea.

Marcus Dixon of the Clifton United Methodist Church said, "All of us, we want to do whatever we possibly can to lift the PTA."

Still, several ministers described a perceived hostile barrier between them and the

ROX 10 Cliffon Min ( schools, which are forbidden from promoting

religion.

(The PTA, because it is not a government agency, can be more liberal in its relations with churches.)

When the ministers were asked whether they felt "locked out of schools," many responded, "Yes!"

Said Philip Baker of New Piney Grove Missionary Baptist Church, "We're locked out because we have a message and it's not a secular message... We're allowed to come in, but we're not allowed to give our message."

He said he was invited to speak about black history in a school but was told "there were certain things I couldn't say."

Just last week, a minister was forcibly ejected from a Cobb County high school assembly for asking students who did not believe in Jesus to stand up.

Like Baker, Tonya Summer of Columbia Drive United Methodist Church agreed to the PTA Sunday, but complained that the schools offer little "reciprocity" to churches, in the form of "[encouraging] children to attend church."

church."

Still, the ministers overwhelmingly supported the new initiative, and many said they plan to join the PTAs of schools in their churches neighborhoods - now that they know it's okay to do so.

The getting-acquainted session and the PTA Sunday, according to Walker, are just

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
