Mary, you have heard from me before. In fact I talked to you on the phone once before. I said I would let you know when I found the MMF cem. The cem. is located off Oakcliff Rd. at 3400 thru 3406 Oakcliff Industrial Center and the rear of the homes on PinOak Cir. There is a wooded area there and the cem. sits about 3/4 of the way down on that lot. It sits on top of a hill. The cem. is in very bad shape. The graves are sunk in and the markers are laying over in the graves where they can not be read. According to Mr Franklin Garrett in his 1930 or 31 round of the cem. the following people are buried there: James C. Corley B-Nov.3, 1856 and D-Jan. 1, 1861. Inscription-Son of R. J. and Ann Corley, Margaret Miller B-no dates given, D-no date given, Margaret C. Miller B-no date given, D-Mar. 23, 1867, Inscription Wife of Sarah Miller, Sarah Miller B-Jan. 10, 1795 and D-Jan. 10, 1854, Amelia F. Morris B-Dec. 16, 1855 and D-Apr. 29, 1858, Inscription-Daughter of Gid and Mary Morris, Elizabeth J. Morris B-Dec. 5, and D-Dec. 17, 1856, Daughter of Gid and Mary Morris, Mary Morris B-May. 13, 1825 and D-May 25, 1868 Inscription Wife of Gid Morris-Daughter of Isreal and Margaret C. Miller. In 1985 a Mr William Benton donated this land to the Lovett school on paces ferry rd. Lovett school now pays the tax on this land according to Dekalb Co. Thought you might like to know.
