

DeKalb May Have Invented The Shopping Center

A distinctly American architectural form, the shopping center, has grown with DeKalb. Perhaps was even invented in DeKalb.

Most of our towns began around a square. Homes mixed with offices for doctors and lawyers, were built around the square. In the days of unpaved roads you could tie your horse to the tree out front.

But the advent of the automobile changed our lifestyle, and the style of our architecture.

DeKalb's first purely retail buildings in the sense of a shopping complex probably were built in 1937 with the construction of the Piggly Wiggly in the Emory Village. The store, a division of Kroger, was built with the radical idea of parking for automobiles. Developer Moe Goldman included 14 off-street parking spaces, and a turn-around adjacent to the new Piggly Wiggly at 1401 South Oxford Rd.

The store, and its innovation of parking spaces, was a success. The building had Piggly Wiggly on one

side and Wheeler's Pharmacy on the other. In 1943 Mr. Goldman built the current Kroger building around the corner at 1554 North Decatur Rd. Moe Goldman's son, George, renovated the building for Kroger.

The original Piggly Wiggly location was leased by Charles Horton who operated Horton's Shop 'N Basket, which was an institution at this location for 36 years. The building today is occupied by University Book Services, a division of Barnes & Noble.

Twin Oaks Shopping Center built in Avondale Estates in 1948 had a parking lot in front of the stores. This radically new form fit well with the thinking of Avondale, the first town in Georgia built to a single master plan. North Decatur Plaza at the corner of North Decatur Road and Clairmont was constructed in 1952.

The pizza style center with 2 long series of retail spaces side by side and parking in front was followed at Belvedere Plaza when Dan Bonner started what was to become DeKalb's largest "strip" shopping center. It

started with a bank building for Decatur Federal Savings and Loan, adjoining a grocery store and pharmacy.

The pattern of building a strip shopping center at an angle at major thoroughfares was followed with the construction of Suburban Plaza in 1960. Anchored at the Church Street side by Winn-Dixie and on the Mellock Road side by Lane Drug Store, the center had large prestige stores including Regesteins, and Belk-Galant. Fashion retailers like Casual Corner were part of the mix. A large S.S. Kresge store was highly successful, so successful that it was one of the last remaining Kresge style stores to stay open as the chain developed its distinctive K mart format elsewhere.

A large portion of land at Suburban Plaza along North Decatur road was held for Rich's, but the Atlanta retailer never constructed the planned store.

Candler Griffith modified the strip concept when they developed Briarcliff Village. Two lines of stores faced each other along a pedestrian mall.

DeKalb May Have Invented The Shopping Center

The most radical change in design sprang from the mind of developer Scott Huggens who bought a large tract at North Druid Hills Road and Lawrenceville Highway. He designed two long parallel lines of stores along a mall - but added an unheard-of concept of covering the mall, enclosing and air conditioning it. It was the first air conditioned mall in the South - perhaps the nation.

The auto had changed the way we shop and changed the countryside. Our destinations became shopping malls, not downtowns, and the expressways followed.

As I-285 was built it ran beside Briarcliff Village, and the intersection of Lavista Road and I-285 became the site for Northlake Mall and the Northlake complex of office buildings.

The Stone Mountain Freeway interchange at I-285 cut a large chunk off the parking lot of North DeKalb Mall, but the mall continued to prosper and it was re-designed and re-opened in 1986 as Metro Square at North DeKalb with 80 stores.

Mervyn's to leave Atlanta; JC Penney buying 3 locations

All seven Mervyn's department stores in metro Atlanta will be closed and sold to other retailers as part of the California chain's exodus from what has become a hypercompetitive market.

Rival JC Penney will buy three of the locations: at Gwinnett Place, Shannon Southpark and Town Center at Cobb malls. Terms weren't disclosed.

The four other stores, in Alpharetta's North Point Mall, at Southlake Festival just off I-75 in Morrow, at North DeKalb Mall in Decatur and at Merchants Walk in Marietta, will be sold. Mervyn's spokeswoman Carol Johnson said negotiations to sell those stores to retailers she wouldn't identify haven't been completed.

Atlanta developer ready to buy North DeKalb Mall

North DeKalb Mall in Decatur is under contract to be sold to Atlanta developer Hendon Properties for an undisclosed price.

Cadillac Fairview, the mall's Toronto-based owner, is attempting to sell its smaller and older regional centers in its portfolio, including North DeKalb and Shannon malls in metro Atlanta.

North DeKalb, at 650,000 square feet, sits at North Druid Hills Road and Lawrenceville Highway.

It's much smaller than the typical mall, but the surrounding area is gentrifying and underserved by retail, said Charlie Hendon, president of Hendon Properties.

"We plan to close by the end of this year," Hendon said. "It's particularly exciting for me because I was born in Atlanta and I've lived in

DeKalb County all my life."

Hendon said he envisions redeveloping the mall, but it's too early to disclose any plans.

North DeKalb Mall is anchored by Rich's-Macy's, Stein Mart and AMC Theaters.

Hendon said it's possible the center could attract more off-price stores or discounters. Hendon has ties to such names as T.J. Maxx, Michael's and others.

Rich's-Macy's spokeswoman Ellen Fruchtman said a renovation of the North DeKalb store is imminent, as is one at Northlake Mall, less than 10 miles away. The department store's operating agreement has long expired at the mall.

When Rich's and Macy's merged in the Southeast earlier this year, the chain converted the former Macy's store at Northlake to a Rich's-Macy's.

North DeKalb Mall offers internships

North DeKalb Mall and its owner, General Growth Properties Inc. (GGP), are offering a new nationwide college internship program called GGP Prodigies.

According to Nicole Krajc, marketing director for Southlake Mall in Morrow, the program is being run in 140 shopping malls that are owned or managed by GGP and offers hands-on professional experience to students in many different disciplines.

"This company is the second largest mall developer in the country, and Southlake Mall is only one of five malls owned by General Growth Properties in Georgia," she said.

Other GGP owned malls in Georgia hosting this program include Shannon Mall, Cumberland Mall and North Point Mall.

She said the internships, which are available on a year-round basis, include disciplines like accounting, advertising, business law, business management, construction management, finance, leasing, market-

ing, public relations, real estate management, technology and visual merchandising.

She said this program was created to be a very flexible part-time program that caters to the student's academic schedule, but could also serve as a stepping stone to future employment with GGP.

"They like to hire from within the company, so there is plenty of opportunity in our company to move up," said Ms. Krajc.

She said each intern's duties would vary with the applicant's schedule, as well as their discipline, but that they must be a junior or senior with at least a 2.5 grade point average.

"I know if they come as a marketing intern they will work with everything in a hands-on manner, doing things like planning events, coordinating our Cash Back for Schools program or talking to the media," she said.

Although the internships are unpaid positions, Ms. Krajc said she works closely with the school of the applicant to ensure they get aca-

demic credit for the internship, as well as copies of the different things they do while working with GGP.

"It's a good way to build up a portfolio, and it puts them directly in the marketing arena," said Ms. Krajc, "It's a great experience for a summer internship."

Developers update aging North Dekalb Mall

To keep pace with Atlanta's fancy modern shopping malls, North Dekalb Mall will get a major face-lift next month.

J.J. Gumberg Co., the Pittsburgh company which owns North Dekalb Mall, has planned several hundred thousand dollars worth of renovation work in and outside the mall. Several tenant stores also are planning their own remodeling.

North Dekalb, the first enclosed shopping center built in the Atlanta area, lately has been losing customers to more eye-appealing malls, according to Mall General Manager Wade Shuman.

"Another reason (for the loss of customers) is the perception that malls with two or more anchor stores are the best places to shop," Shuman said. North Dekalb is a unique mall with Rich's as its only anchor store, he said. "But to our way of thinking, you don't have a mall without a Rich's," he said.

Consequently, Gumberg company officials are not willing to concede the shift in customers to surrounding shopping malls.

Customers recently shopping at North Dekalb al-

ready may have noticed ongoing construction at the Rich's store which has remodeled and added 18,000 square feet of floor space.

"The Rich's store here was built in 1965, and we needed to update the store to keep up with the times," said Mel Tillern, general manager of Rich's at North Dekalb Mall.

The remodeling, which cost Rich's millions of dollars, already has increased business at the store, Tillern said. "The customer flow has most noticeably increased in the new areas of the store."

Renovation work for the mall is scheduled to begin during the first week of August. Most of the changes will be made inside, Shuman said.

A new lighting system will be installed throughout the mall. "When this mall was built back in 1966, the stores were not open during evening hours," Shuman said. "We've needed brighter lights for nighttime shopping."

Other interior changes include colorful banners, plants, carpet and benches.

Outside the mall, a 9-foot-wide stucco band will stretch around the top of the mall, covering the stone arch at the front mall entrance. Store entrances will be more clearly marked along the band, Shuman said.

The outside brick wall of the shopping center will be cleaned and resealed. Waterproofing has been required because old age and weather has made the brick porous, he said.

Perhaps the most noticed change in the mall will be its new sign in the front parking lot. The old sign with the red and globe design will be replaced with a large pylon and billboard.





North Dekalb Mall To Reopen Friday As Marketsquare

Dekalb's newest and oldest with a select group of eatories to shopping mall will open Saturday morning.

The exterior of Marketsquare Shopping Mall, at 9 a.m. with a ribbon-cutting which will feature a three-color sculptured local dignitaries and Lt. The vans can travel from 30 to 50 miles before they must be recharged.

"The vans are energy-efficient, non-polluting and quiet — very much in keeping with the atmosphere of the park," White noted. "In addition, there's no coolant, transmission fluid, or oil to maintain. Routine maintenance is confined primarily to topping the battery water levels about every three weeks."



Here's How The Upgraded Mall Looks On Eve Of Grand Reopening






New Sign At Marketsquare Entrance Just Before Opening



21-Years Later, Dekalb Mall Makes Grand Reappearance

ter any longer. It's now called Market Square at North Dekalb. And, it isn't an opening. It's a grand reopening.

It was Thursday, July 29, 1965, and Miss Dekalb County, Sue Griffiths, was preparing to help open the Atlanta area's newest shopping mall. North Dekalb Center at North Druid Hills and Lawrenceville Highway.

Developer Scott Ridgeway was inviting Dekalb shoppers to experience something relatively new in the southeast: completely indoor, air-conditioned shopping at more than one store, all under one roof. Ridgeway had Rich's, Butler's, J.C. Penney's, Friedman Jewelers, Diana Shops and Bell Brothers Shoes. When shoppers arrive after the year.

Developer Scott Ridgeway was urging folks to try the "stores with no doors concept." And, the new mall's 850-seat theater was being loaded the projector with one of the year's new rentals, "Lord Jim."

Besides the mall, Dekalb County was building in those days about major league sports coming to Atlanta, construction of a new conference in Decatur, the opening World's Fair and the future direction of something called the Stone Mountain Freeway.

TWENTY-ONE YEARS and a few months later, the major league teams are all here, one courthouse has been built and another is needed, the war is over and the Stone Mountain Freeway is stopped where it is — although some don't believe that.

projection includes development that Mr. Ridgeway and Cadillac Fairview expect will come from their marketing of six "out-parcels" between the mall and North Druid Hills Road.

SHOPPERS WILL still have access from North Druid and Lawrenceville Highway. In addition, the developer has improved and extended Orion Road, widened Lawrenceville Highway and paid for a traffic signal east of the mall, providing access at Orion and Lawrenceville Highway, near one of the Stone Mountain Freeway's interchanges.

The exterior of the mall is now in three-color sculptured stucco design. Canopies will be placed at each exterior tenant entrance. Inside are 10,000 sq. ft. of green-tinted glass skylights. Flooring includes 652,000 sq. ft. of imported Italian marbles.

A food court with seating for 350 people will be provided. A new 25,000 sq. ft. movie theater has been built. The new developers acquired the center in mid-1985, and work began one year ago. It took two years to build the original mall.

In addition, some 65,000 sq. ft. has been added to the 226,000 sq. ft. mall area itself, providing space for 120 specialty stores, more than double the 55 retail locations the


mall previously had. Wayne Shaeffer, manager of land development for Cadillac Fairview, says first year sales for all stores at the mall should top \$125 million, more than double present gross. The developers believe the expansion will create 1,500 job posi-

Electric Van Will Be Tested At Stone Mountain

The Stone Mountain Park Authority will have the benefit of an electric-powered van provided by Georgia Power Co. in a field test to determine what functions such vehicles can be used for in everyday jobs.

The General Motors "Griffon" van is one of three vans purchased by Georgia Power Co., Alabama Power Co. and Southern Company Services. Georgia Power Co. is currently assessing the van's performances, and Stone Mountain's six-month field test is a vital element in that assessment.

The Southern electric system is interested in electric vehicles because they can be recharged at night with off-peak power. Thus, they offer an opportunity to sell additional energy without building new generating capacity.

"Electric vehicles are especially attractive for uses requiring numerous starts and stops and considerable idling time," said Jim White, senior power marketing engineer in Georgia Power's Tucker district office.

"Traditional gasoline-powered vehicles are fairly inefficient under those type circumstances, and that's why Stone Mountain is an excellent place to test this vehicle," White added. "They'll be using the van principally for short-distance deliveries between various park facilities."

In place of an internal combustion engine, each van has 36 six-volt lead-acid batteries mounted under the floor of the vehicle. The batteries are partially regenerated when the brakes are engaged, but take eight to 10 hours to recharge completely when drained. The vans can travel from 60 to 60 miles before they must be recharged.

"The vans are energy-efficient,

non-polluting and quiet — very much in keeping with the atmosphere at the park," White noted.

"In addition, there's no exhaust, transmission fluid, or oil to maintain. Routine maintenance is confined primarily to topping the battery water levels about every three weeks."



Northside currently has three airport express service terminals in DeKalb County: 1850 Cotillion Dr., Dunwoody; 3110 Presidential Dr., Doraville; and 3940 Rock Bridge

Road, Stone Mountain.

Rogers formerly was employed by Rollins Inc. of Atlanta where he was director of human resources.








A Century Of Fashion




