

The Stone Mountain Woman's Club has selected the Kelly Bryan family as its 1991-92 Family of the Year. Kelly, Marty, and their children — Robbie, 12 and a half; Elizabeth, 10 and a half; and Joey, six and a half — have lived in Stone Mountain since 1977.

Marty, a registered nurse, is a full-time homemaker and "professional volunteer." She has been a member of the Stone Mountain Woman's Club for 11 years. As second vice president, she is required to organize and lead the committee chairmen in all community projects for the club. Past club responsibilities have included Education Department and Tallulah Falls School Department chairmanships, concession stand chairman for the annual Stone Mountain Woman's Club Horse Show and luncheon chairman for the club's home tour.
