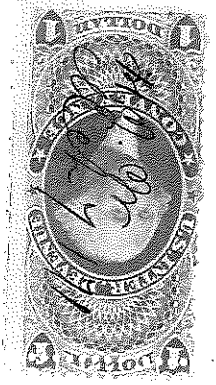

BOND CLERK SUP. COURT.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, *William McIlwain*, as Principal, and *J. C. Shaw*, *J. R. McIlwain* and *J. R. McIlwain*, as Sureties, are held and firmly bound unto His Excellency, RUFUS B. BULLOCK, Governor of the State of Georgia, and his successors in Office, in the just and full sum of **Three Thousand Dollars**, to the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents; sealed with our seals, and dated this 7 day of March 1864 Eighteen Hundred and ~~Sixty-~~ 71.

THE CONDITION OF SAID BOND IS SUCH, That, Whereas, The above bound *William McIlwain* was, on the 23 day of December, 1860, duly and legally elected Clerk of the Superior Court in and for said County of DeKalb, for the year *1861*; NOW, should the said *William McIlwain* faithfully discharge the duties of said office of Clerk of the Superior Court in and for said County, during the time he continues therein, or discharges any of the duties thereof, then the above Bond to be void—else to be of full force.

DIRECTIONS.

The above Bond must not be approved unless it has at least two good and solvent sureties, and not more than ten; all of whom must be permanent residents of the State, and two also of the County, and freeholders thereof. When the approving officer does not, of his own knowledge, know that a surety is worth enough to enable him to accept him, he shall not take him unless he swears to his means, and it is satisfactory; of which swearing he shall make a minute on the Bond. (Code of Georgia, Sec. 141, and Act of 17th March, 1864.)

If the Bond be signed by an attorney in fact, the power of attorney must be attested by a Justice of the Peace, and filed and recorded as the Bond is. (Code, Sec. 142.)

The officer in whose office the Bond is filed must endorse thereon the day and year of filing it, and sign his name to such endorsement. (Code, Sec. 146.)

The bond must be approved by the Ordinary, and be by him recorded.
