BACKGROUND

The Solomon Goodwin House was probably built by Harris Goodwin in the early 1830's and enlarged in the 1840's. Harris's father Solomon came there to live in 1837 and bought the surrounding 500 plus acres of land in 1838. Except for a short time after the Civil War the property has always been in the family. It now belongs to three sisters of the seventh generation.

The cemetery was started by Micajah Hall in 1876 and contains 30 graves, all related to the family.

The Solomon Goodwin House has survived nearly two centuries of dramatic transitions in the hands of a middle-class family that always managed, by the skin of their teeth, to keep some piece of the land with the house and graveyard.

PURPOSE

The Foundation wishes to build on this legacy to provide, in these times of great transition, a sense of place and community. We propose to provide a refuge that takes full advantage of the secluded feeling created by the graveyard, woods and a house set back from the road in the middle of a busy commercial district. The Foundation's goals are to offer a shared history of a typical Southern middle class family, a place to heal and worship, and a place to experience ones roots within the community.

MISSION

The Goodwin House Foundation, Inc., a registered Georgia not-for-profit corporation, exists to:

- Protect, preserve and restore the Historic Goodwin House, grounds, and cemetery as a living part of the Brookhaven Community.
- Research and record the history and heritage of the Goodwin House, its occupants and neighbors.

NEEDS

To further the mission and goals of the Goodwin House Foundation, there is need of creativity, professional assistance, skilled and unskilled labor, endowments and money. 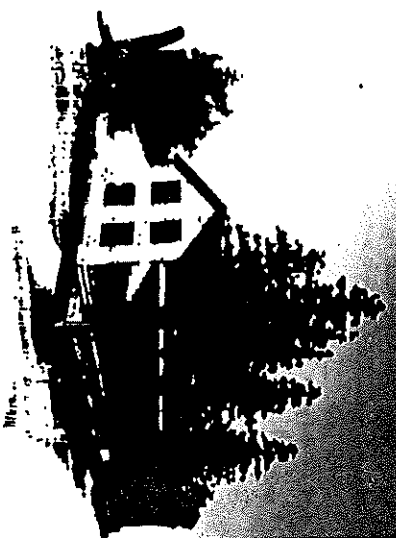

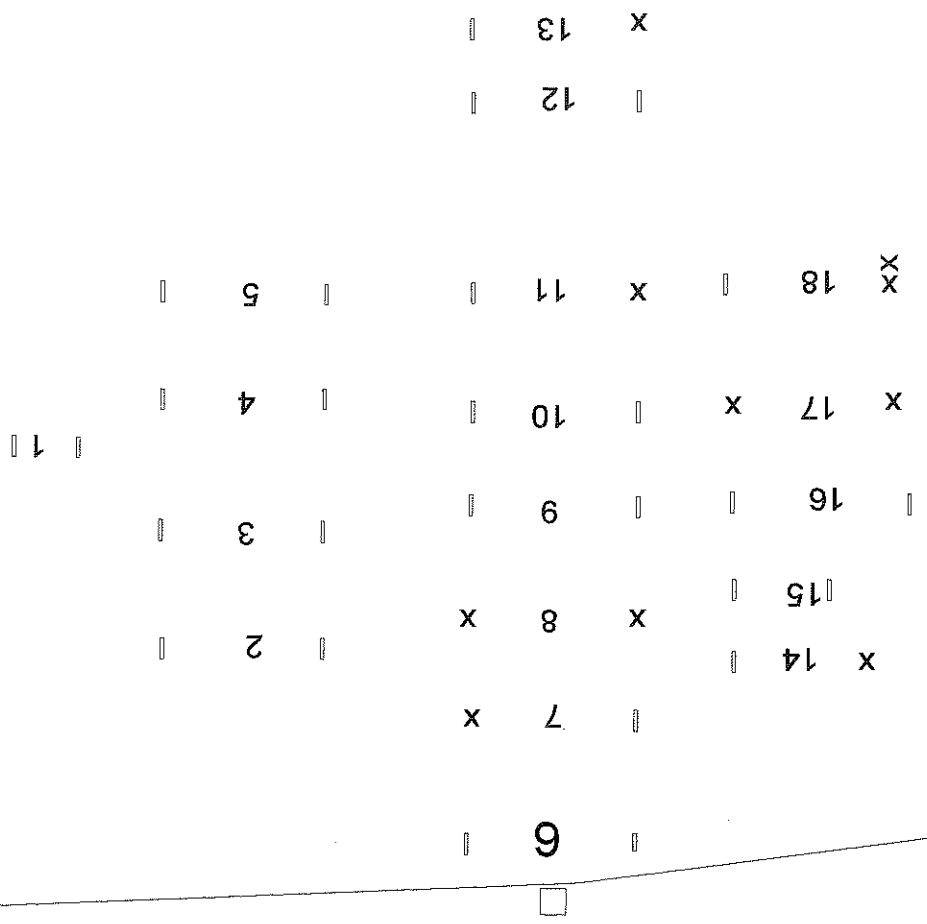
