She was preceded in death by her parents and by her brother, Roy Slaton Tuggle, Jr. Surviving her are her sister-in-law, Ruth Johnson Tuggle, her niece, Sherry Lynne Tuggle, and her nephew, Roy Slaton Tuggle, III (and his wife, Pattie). The next generation, Roy Slaton Tuggle, IV, Brett Andrew Tuggle, and Jennifer Pauline Tuggle also survive her. Virginia had a long career in the retail clothing business. She worked as a buyer in women's fashion in large department stores in Atlanta, Nashville, and Indianapolis, and at Saks in New York City. She later moved back to Atlanta to operate her own retail clothing store. Virginia grew up attending Peachtree Baptist Church and had many friends there. In later years she participated in and travelled with the Young at Heart group at Peachtree. Wherever she lived, Virginia made numerous friends with whom she continued an active correspondence for the rest of her life. In retirement she travelled extensively, always accompanied by friends or relatives. She was an accomplished bridge player, maintaining several different sets of bridge-playing friends during her long retirement. A sixty-year member of Druid Hills Golf Club, Virginia enjoyed taking family and friends to "the Club." She was an accomplished hostess, who enjoyed giving parties for holidays and family events. The food at her home parties was legendary! Virginia loved her brother's children and three grandchildren, whom she treated as her own. They knew her as "Ginga," a toddler's mispronunciation of "Virginia" that stuck with her for life. She was actively involved in their upbringing, ranging from babysitting when the children were small, to more extensive family outings as they grew. Throughout her later years, she maintained diverse activities and interests, including cooking, family deep-sea fishing trips, berry-picking expeditions, and avidly following Georgia Bulldogs women's basketball (with strong opinions on many current college coaches!) Virginia had a generous spirit and loved giving gifts to family and friends throughout the year. In her last years, Virginia was the family historian, often receiving visits from much younger relatives who asked her to explain family genealogy and history and to identify the subjects of old photographs. A strong and loving personality with decided opinions, Virginia will be greatly missed. 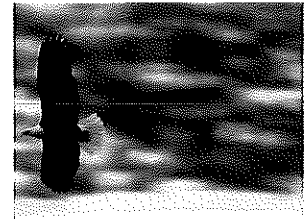

He graduated from Druid Hills High School and later from the University of Georgia, graduating in 1942 with a degree in business. There he was a member of Epsilon Sigma Beta business fraternity and Phi Delta Theta social fraternity. He was a lifelong Bulldog, enjoying season ticket seats at Georgia football games for many years. He was married to Ruth Johnson of Live Oak, Florida, also a Georgia graduate, in 1946, and they had two children, Roy Slaton Tuggle, III (wife, Pattie) of Atlanta, and Sherry Lynne Tuggle of Monticello. For many years, he and his father operated the R. S. Tuggle Dairy at the corner of Briarcliff and North Druid Hills Roads in DeKalb County. They specialized in the bottling and home and restaurant delivery of fresh milk products. As that area developed, he eventually moved his farming operation to Gwinnett County and later to Jasper County, where he raised beef cattle. He continued to enjoy keeping his family supplied with fresh milk. He also pursued additional business interests, including owning and managing several Fruit Basket grocery stores in Forest Park, Chamblee, and on Ponce de Leon Avenue, while maintaining his farming operation. He took pride in offering fresh-cut meats and quality produce, long before the idea was popularized by modern chain stores. His three grandchildren (Roy Slaton Tuggle, IV, Brett Andrew Tuggle, and Jennifer Tuggle) were always a source of satisfaction, pride and joy, and he loved entertaining them and their friends at his and Ruth's home near Monticello, Georgia. He loved the Bulldogs, cattle farming, vegetable gardening, pets, steak, poker, and his family. He had a dry wit and loved to tease. He will be greatly missed. He is survived by his wife, his sister, his two children, and his three grandchildren. Roy Slaton Tuggle, Sr., a longtime DeKalb County dairy farmer and one of DeKalb's oldest residents died Friday. He was 103. Services will be at A.S. Turner & Sons in Decatur Monday at 2:00 and burial will be in Decatur Cemetery. He was born January 19, 1891 in DeKalb County, one of 10 children. The family home where he grew up was a familiar white frame house that stood at the corner of Briarcliff and North Druid Hills Roads until 1985. Four generations of the Tuggle family remained in DeKalb County until the time of his death. Mr. Tuggle established himself in the dairy business, beginning with two cows on rented land. Long before motorized vehicles became common in DeKalb County, Mr. Tuggle ran a residential milk delivery service using horse and mule-drawn vehicles. The R.S. Tuggle Dairy remained in operation until the 1950's when Mr. Tuggle's pastures were acquired by DeKalb County for construction of the former Briarcliff High School, the present Kirtledge Magnet School, and Adams Stadium. In 1914 Mr. Tuggle was married to Lessie Eveline Jones, and they had two children, Virginia and Roy, Jr. Family and friends celebrated their 50th, 60th, and 65th wedding anniversaries before her death in 1982. After retirement in the 1950's Mr. Tuggle remained active and in good health. He traveled often with his family, but adamantly refused to fly in an airplane. He enjoyed reading, working in his yard, and reminiscing about old days in DeKalb County. Surviving are daughter, Virginia Tuggle, son and daughter-in-law, Roy and Ruth Tuggle, granddaughter, Sherry Tuggle, grandson and daughter-in-law, Slaton and Pattie Tuggle, and great grandchildren, Slaton IV, Brett and Jennifer. Following the death of his wife at 8:30 o'clock Monday night, J. T. Tuggle, a well-to-do farmer who lives on the Wallace Mill road, was found dead in bed Tuesday morning about 5 o'clock.

Mrs. Tuggle was fifty-eight years old and Mr. Tuggle was fifty-nine years old. They had been married about thirty years.

About two hours after his wife's death, Mr. Tuggle said he would lie down and rest. Later, as no sound issued from the room, he was thought to be asleep, and others in the house would not disturb his rest. It was not known he was dead until early Tuesday morning. Death is believed to have been due to heart failure.

The couple is survived by five sons, William, Clyde, C. C., Roy and Dr. G. C. Tuggle, and four daughters, Mrs. A. B. Houston, Mrs. J. L. Johnston, Mrs. B. A. Morgan and Miss Minnie Tuggle. Mr. Tuggle also leaves one sister, Mrs. Elizabeth B. Parks of Birmingham.

A double funeral will be held Wednesday from the Peachtree church and husband and wife will be buried side

by side in the churchyard. H. M. Patterson has charge of the arrangements.

This is the second double funeral in the family, the other occurring about a year ago when J. A. Tuggle and his business partner died at the same time.

Fate Of Old Dairy Still Up In The Air

At the corner of Briarcliff and 4th Druid Hills Roads stands the Tuggle home, site of the Tuggle Dairy which dates back before the turn of the century when milk was hauled by wagons and mules.

A rezoning decision last winter is for the Tuggle property to be converted to a 170,570 square foot shopping center, to be developed by Aderhold and Treprow Development Company.
The land's been sold; grading will begin this fall. In the meantime, the house, with its two-story balcony, still stands guard over the lot.

Though it's been vacant for a number of years, and needs major repairs, a DeKalb man has said he'd like to move it and would be willing to invest a sizeable sum of his own money to do so.

PERHAPS a DeKalb trend is about to begin: just last week what is believed to be the oldest home in the county was rescued from the wreck. Developer Tom Williams donated the 160-year-old Towers-Fow-

ler-Thompson house located at Northern and Rockbridge Roads to a Stone Mountain family who is having it moved to a new site.

According to Dorothy Nix of the DeKalb Historical Society, hundreds of calls came in regarding the future of the old house.

But she's also had calls about the Tuggle home, she said, including one from Bob Henry who lives in the Chamblee-Doraville area.

Mr. Henry said he's got land available in Henry County, and if he can move and renovate the old home for under his personal budget—any cap of \$50,000 then he wants it.

He doesn't know, however, if it can be done for that amount, and said he cannot request an estimate from a mover until Mr. Aderhold gives him the go-ahead.

MR. ADERHOLD said he doesn't know what his company will do with the rambling 11-room house which gradually grew as the Tuggle family grew.

"What do you do with an old house?" he asked.
"It's not for sale; it's not going to

be for sale," Mr. Aderhold continued.

He said the house will have to be "displaced" before construction may begin, either by tearing it down or by soliciting competitive bids from people interested in acquiring it and moving it.

At present, though, no decision has been made, he said.
